## The Yarner copper mine.

The area immediately in front of us, which is now woodland, in the later part of the middle of the 19<sup>th</sup> century this was an open hillside and down below us was a copper mine, the Yarner Copper mine, also known as the Yarrow Mine I think, and after the mine closed, sometime in the 1860s, 1870s, this area in front of us was planted up with a mixture of tree species, mainly conifers, and that's why we can see all the pines here, and this bit was known as the Black Wood.
