Attached to the little cottage that was formed by the 17th century wing are what was originally a stable and a shippon, which would have been added probably sometime in the 18th or early 19th century; and in the 1970s that building was converted into more domestic accommodation, so by the late 1970s that, together with the historic wing was a four-bedroomed house, and it came up on the market in 2001 and the National Park Authority thought that it would be a good idea to combine the two halves of Higher Uppacott back together again and with the aid of Heritage Lottery funding was able to purchase that.
